- *teaching digital futures in geography.*

Submission of papers on other aspects of teaching and learning in geography will also be welcomed.

Participants are welcome to submit abstracts relevant to the Commission on Geographical Education. Please indicate at the bottom of your abstract that you would like to present within the framework of the Commission of Geographical Education , commission number 11.

Abstracts will be sent for review and authors will be informed in due time whether their abstract/s have been accepted. Inclusion of abstracts in the scientific program and on the Disc of Abstracts is dependent on payment of registration fees.

If by email, the abstract should be saved as a Word document and sent as an attachment, please do not send as a PDF file. If using Word 2007, please save file as a document that can be opened in Word 2003.

The deadline for the receipt of abstracts is: MARCH 15, 2010.
